I am pleased to report that it was a success. Ten people came, and I sold and signed 11 copies of *Hamilton Versus Wall Street, The Core Principles of the American System*.

I gave a small talk in which I addressed three points: 1) how I became interested in Hamilton through the Report on Manufactures; 2) why I revived the project now, in the context of the popularity of the Hamilton musical; and 3) the unique perspective which my book brings to the discussion on Hamilton, specifically the content and history of the [American System](#) of Economics. A lively discussion followed.

Hopefully this will be the first of many such events, building

up to the major American Book Expo at the end of May/beginning of June in New York City. I am still in the process of raising money to fund my attendance, which will also include a book signing in the midst of a huge audience attending the Expo's public session.
